In total 18 Kingsley fighters took part in 7 competitions last year, and between them won 24 medals. 5 Gold, 7 Silver and 12 Bronze medals. The club judoka competed in 116 contests during the year and won 50 and lost 66 bouts. This is an encouraging set of statistics and I'm looking forward to greatly improving these results in 2012.



## Count Down To The Olympics

The BJA have announced their 2012 British Olympic Squad, 27 Judoka where selected by finishing inside the Top 100 within the World Rankings in their weight divisions. The squad will now focus solely on training and making the final 14 places in the team .

15 British woman have by far out-performed the 12 male judoka on the world ranking circuit to qualify for the 2012 team. It will only mean a very interesting final few months build up to the games, as all but two weight class has two or more females fighting it out for a team spot.

A young 15 yr old newcomer has suddenly risen into the team after recently winning a bronze in the World Junior Championships, Hayley Willis from Stratford will certainly be a home favourite. Or could Karina Bryant finally add a major title to a long list of International Silver medals .





Dojo = Training Room


Judoka = Person doing Judo

#### Devon Senior Kyu Grade Championships

The Kingsley School Judo team fought tremendously well in the Devon Kyu Grade Championships held in Kingsbridge. The event is for senior competitors over the age of 16 and all Judoka fighting have to be non-black belts.

The tournament attracted a good mix of younger and older fighters from many local clubs within the West of England. With just over 100 fighters battling it out for medals and for some the magical chance of winning points towards the ultimate Black Belt them-

Three members from club took part in the championships with 6<sup>th</sup> form pupil Samuel Foulser in outstanding form winning a Gold medal in the 1<sup>st</sup> Kyu -66kg category and collecting his first 40 points towards his 1<sup>st</sup> Dan black belt.

Sam won all four bouts with classic Ippon "Knock Out" throwing techniques including the best one, a massive Te-Guruma in the final against Joesph Milne from Shepton Mallet Judo club.

Sam said "I'm very happy with my performance, I had a game plan and wanted to stick to the techniques I had been training hard to develop for competition, everything went to plan and winning 40 points was a brilliant bonus"

Gregor Herkewitz 18 is currently a working Gap student at the school from Germany, and is also still part of an British Judo Association adult beginners course at Kingsley. He won an incredibly Silver medal after just a few weeks of Judo training. He fought in the novice to Blue belt 2<sup>nd</sup> Kyu -90kg class. Gregor won three out of four bouts and beat much higher graded competitors along the way. He only just lost the final to Finian O'Donnell from Newquay by a hold down, but it was Gregor who scored a yoko 5pts first and held his opponent down before Finian escaped and re-held Gregor down for Ippon. It was only the lack of experience in escaping which cost him a Gold medal.

Ryan Ashton 16 fought in the novice to Blue belt 2<sup>nd</sup> Kyu -81kg class, Ryan fought well but found the difference in strength a little too much to handle as he had just failed to make his normal -73kg weight class. Ryan had three bouts and tried his very best in each weight class. Nyahi had intele bods and their his very best in each contest, it was a good learning experience for him and hopefully he will develop and improve his judo for next time.
